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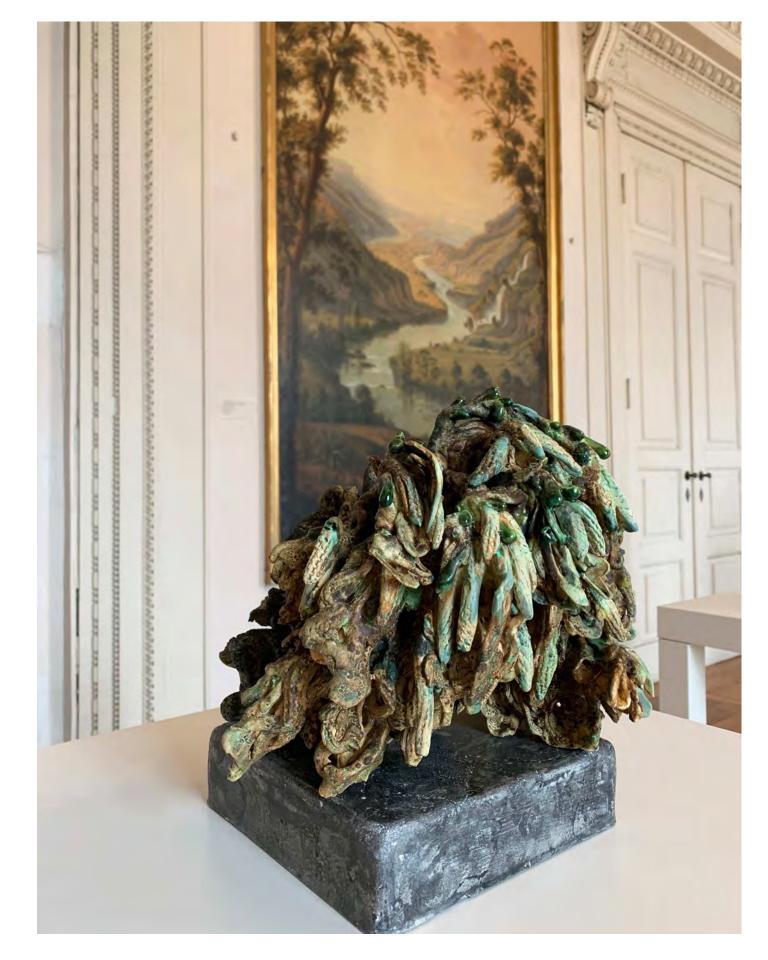






















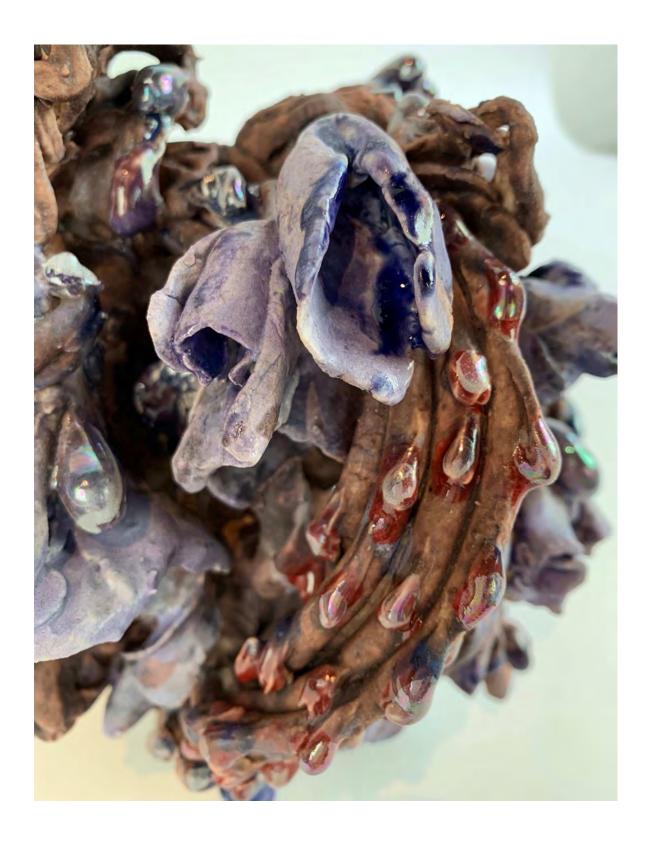








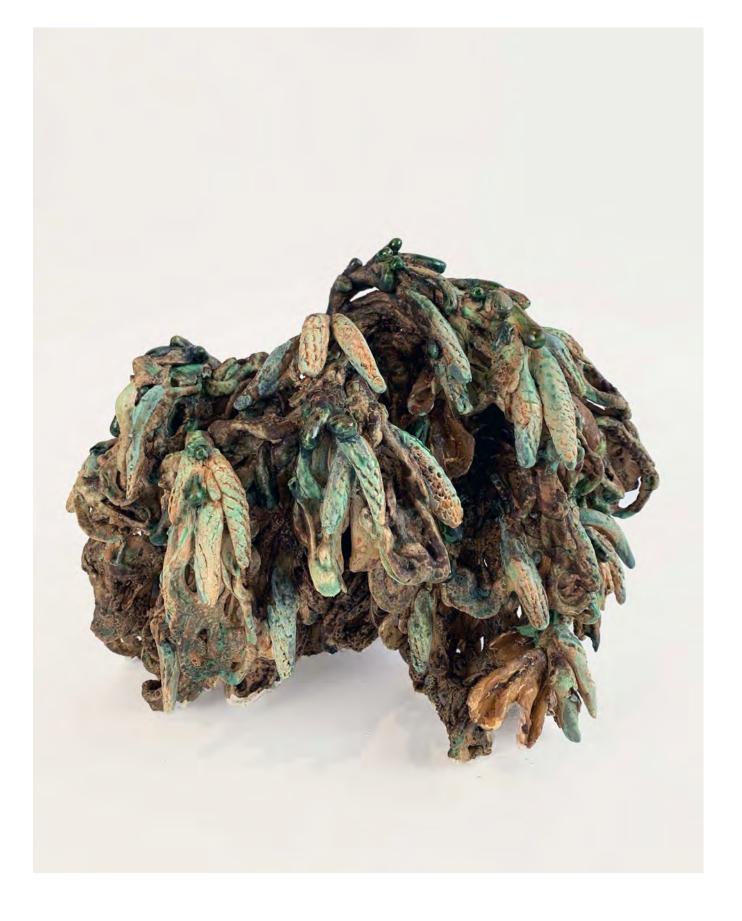










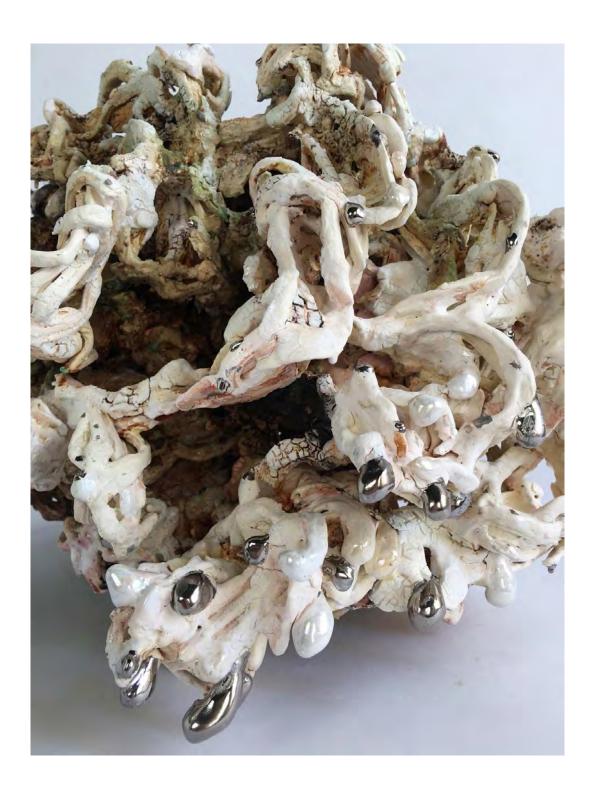














SuSan Collett CLAY~Sculpture~PRINTS

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ArtistStatement

My full time studio practice includes clay sculpture and printmaking.

The clay work derives from interest in the tension of strength against fragility and as I push towards the edge of physical collapse, this theme becomes more potent. The work is handbuilt and sculptural in nature. A two-dimensional background in printmaking informs the Racine Series using nichrome wire as a linear element and as a substructure of support to the clay used in a liquid slip form. The use of light interplay provides a perceived fragility explored through stacking and channeling of slab and slip trailed clay, exploring light passage that is pushing towards a body scale relationship.

The work was hand-built and often turned, tilted, built upon and re-fired repeatedly as analogy of a life process: of time and collecting, coming together and falling apart, of forgetting and letting go, a transience leading to regeneration pointed to in the culminating multi-colour florets and crystal droplets.

I am searching themes within heaving, disrupted, up-rooted form that hovers in the space between the solid and the liquid, the fissure between order and chaos of fluidity and brittleness.

My interpretation of these contrasts take sculptural form within the layers of the Racine series with its folds and crevices that references our fragile inner systems, the delicacy and fine line of inner functioning and adaptability against a powerfully mercurial exterior world.
